How Many Squares Can You Spare?

The goal of this icebreaker is to introduce each student to one another in the classroom. This can also be used as the first "impromptu speech" that the students will give.

Materials:

• 1-4 rolls of toilet paper (depending on class size)

Description:

- Start by passing around a roll of toilet paper to the class.
- Explain to the class that each student must take at least one square of toilet paper but must not exceed 20 squares.
- Once each student has taken their desired amount of toilet paper, explain to the class that for every square of toilet paper that they have taken, the student must stand at the front of the class and say something about their lives or a character trait. For example, if a student takes four squares, they must say four things about them self.
- Go around the classroom and have each student one at a time present to the class their mini impromptu speech with facts about themselves depending on the amount of squares they hold.
- Guidelines should be set (i.e. no profanity).
